#### **Little Things Watching Little Things**

- · I Spy A Fly. Save the centers of toilet paper rolls. These will be your spy tubes. Decorate them with yarn or make an animal collage. Go on a hike and focus on the teeny weeny things.
- Shrink The Kids. Cut a string about 50 ft. (16 m.) long. Teil the kids you're shrinking them down to ant size. Have them crawl along the string. Play a guessing game and have them answer like an ant or any small creature. What's my favorite food? Sugar!
- Creature Pit Stop. Dig a small hole in a shady cool place outside. Put an empty vogurt container in it. Make a little roof with a board supported by rocks. Leave some bait - cookie crumbs, cheese. Go back the next day and see what's there.



## Problem Alert!

#### Oh, The Big Things You'd Miss!

Make an "I'd miss a "bulletin board. Have the kids draw pictures of the animals they would miss if they were to disappear. You can do this with plants as well for the next chapter.

### Animal Appreciation

Lots of big people need to be reminded about the importance of all living creatures. Let each child draw a picture of a dolphin, whale, penguin, anaconda (big snake), or panda bear. They can take it home to their family and ask for help in learning more about it at the library.



# **Solutions To Pollution...**

- Sunflower sack. Send home a baggie full of sunflower seeds. Ask the kids to put the seeds outside and report back to the class if the seeds disappeared. Do they know what ate them?
- Habitat help. Have the kids pack an empty onion bag or net bag with things that birds could use in their nests-yarn, small sticks, leaves. Put it in a steady spot on a tree branch.
- A splash bath. Make a wildlife bath out of a large foil pan.
